Lebanon Downtown Revitalization Lebanon, TN



Check out historic downtown Lebanon, Tennessee— a shining example of small-town revitalization through historic preservation, strategic investment, and community partnership. Over the past decade, Lebanon has transformed its downtown core through multi-modal streetscape improvements, the restoration of iconic buildings like the Arcade and Capitol Theatre and the launch of impactful programs such as the Façade Improvement Grant and the Restaurant Resiliency program. Since earning its Tennessee Main Street designation in 2013, the city has leveraged its historic assets, commuter rail access, and growing population to attract nearly \$6 million in public-private reinvestment, revitalizing 23 buildings and spurring a vibrant mix of retail, dining, and business. This tour will highlight how Lebanon's coordinated efforts in infrastructure, design, and small business support have catalyzed a thriving downtown, offering valuable insights for rural economic development leaders seeking scalable models of success.

Trolley Barn Reuse & Revitalization Tour Nashville, TN



Rolling Mill Hill, a historic, in-town neighborhood, is the former home of Metro General Hospital and Metro's government vehicle fleet center (the "trolley barns"). The area is located on a bluff just south of Broadway and Korean Veterans Boulevard. The neighborhood is also located within the larger Rutledge Hill Redevelopment District.

The area is a locally designated landmark that the went through a community-led preservation and adaptive reuse effort. The first hospital structure, a Victorian-style building dating to the 1890s, has been converted to residential use, along with a 1930s Art Deco-style building. The trolley barns, which have been included on the National Register of Historic Places, were converted to office and commercial space. The historic smokestack, which is visible from several points downtown and to the east, also has been preserved and will continue to serve as a landmark and icon for the area.

In addition, several publicly-owned vacant sites have been redeveloped through public-private partnerships, these sites have brought additional office, residential, and commercial uses to the area. A notable public improvement within the area is the extension of the City's greenway system that runs through Rolling Mill Hill and provides pedestrians and cyclists access to downtown as well as the City's broader greenway network. This greenway has multiple scenic river overlook vantage points within the Rolling Mill Hill Community.
